



Are you purchasing a home?

Do you think you have been a victim of housing discrimination?

The most common way you can experience discrimination while looking to buy a house is to be *steered*.

“Steering” is

- When an agent suggests a customer purchase a home in a particular neighborhood on the basis of race or national origin even though the customer has asked to see homes in a different neighborhood; and/or
- When an agent fails, because of race or national origin, to show a buyer homes or to inform a buyer of homes that meet their specifications.

Mortgage lending discrimination is a practice of banks, governments or other lending institutions denying loans on the basis of race, national origin, sex, religion, disability, age, legal source of income, marital status, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression.
